This funding will be used to

- Improve NAPLAN (National Assessment Program: Literacy and Numeracy) performance - students achieving results that are at or above National Minimum Standards
 - Reading Year 3 = 99% Year 5 = 99%
 - Numeracy Year 3 = 99% Year 5 = 99%
- Improve NAPLAN performance - students achieving results within the Upper Two Bands
 - Reading Year 3 = 50% Year 5 = 35%
 - Numeracy Year 3 = 35% Year 5 = 50%
- Improve student achievement - 80% or greater of all students achieving a 'C' or better in English, Mathematics and Science
- Improve student attendance - 92% or better student attendance

Our initiatives include

- Expanding opportunities for student engagement, focused teaching and intervention.
- Consistent implementation of the whole school Reading and Numeracy plans through the support of a Pedagogical Coach.
- Providing full time teacher aide in Prep composite class to support early Literacy and Numeracy development.
- Providing teacher aide to support literacy intervention programs.
- Providing teacher aide to support numeracy intervention.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employ a teacher to improve opportunities for student engagement, focused teaching and intervention. \$ 84, 016
- Employ a pedagogical coach to support the implementation of the school Reading program \$ 46, 178
- Employ teacher aides to support literacy and numeracy interventions \$ 22, 599
- Employ teacher aides to support numeracy interventions \$ 22, 589
- Provide professional development to teachers to implement engaging, age appropriate teaching and learning by implementing the Walker Learning Approach \$ 6, 500
