Health & Safety Fact Sheet

Infectious Disease at School/Work What to Do

When presented with the information that a staff member, student or other member of the community (e.g. volunteer) - has been diagnosed with an infectious disease, the principal/institute director/officer-in-charge will need to take action to protect the school community.

STEP 1 - GATHER INFORMATION

- 1. Read the Queensland Health Fact Sheet for the disease?
- 2. Is it a Contagious Condition? (see table below)
- 3. Has the condition been diagnosed/confirmed by a doctor?
- 4. How long has the person been sick?
- 5. Has the person been sick while in the school/workplace?

STEP 2 - MANAGEMENT of a CONTAGIOUS CONDITION

Exclusion - refer to the Queensland Health <u>"TIME OUT"</u> poster for exclusion requirements.

Contact the local Queensland Health <u>Public Health Unit</u> to inform them of the case and follow any advice they provide for local management/containment and recommended communications.

STEP 3 - MANAGEMENT of other INFECTIOUS DISEASES

e.g. Cold sores, conjunctivitis, CMV, Influenza, Streptococcal sore throat, mumps, parvovirus, Glandular Fever etc

- o If required, provide general information to the class or the school community e.g. a letter to parents with a copy of the <u>Queensland Health Fact Sheet</u> or an article in the newsletter.

Staying Home When Unwell: Adults (including TAFE students) who have been diagnosed with a contagious condition should follow medical advice with respect to exclusion from and return to the workplace. As a guide, adults should refer to the Queensland Health "TIME OUT" poster or the relevant Queensland Health fact sheet for information on the recommended minimum exclusion periods for infectious diseases.

NOTE FOR SCHOOLS – CONTAGIOUS CONDITIONS: If a member of school staff or a school student advises that they have been medically diagnosed with a *contagious condition* as defined by the *Public Health Act 2005* it is vital that steps are taken to protect the health of the school community in a timely manner in accordance with the *Public Health Act* and *Regulation 2005*.

Schools should contact the relevant regional officer to advise of the situation and any action taken.
